Back to School Information

In preparation for the 2020-21 school year, we have implemented learning opportunities based on information from parents and students and our ever-evolving news regarding COVID-19. These are “interesting” times for education to say the least, but never has our commitment been greater to serve our families and help our students move forward academically, socially/emotionally, spiritually, and with their future goals beyond high school.

Based on local ordinances and recommendations, THA Staff will wear a face covering while in the school building unless they are alone in the room or unless they have health reasons. The city ordinance does not mandate the use of face coverings for children under 18. We have reconfigured our learning spaces so that social distance standards are met. Many of our students have conditions that make it difficult or unsafe for them to wear face coverings. They will not be required to do, but if they prefer to wear face coverings will be provided. Please use the guidelines below on recommendations including do not attend on campus if you are experiencing flu-like or cold-like symptoms (listed below).

Please know that the health and safety of our students and staff continues to be our #1 priority. Tulsa Hope Academy will continue to follow the guidance and expertise of state and local officials in order to protect our students and staff. The following details on the safety measures in place; are subject to change as the situation will continue to be fluid. We encourage you to check our website weekly for updates, as this is where you will always find the latest information at www.tulsaohope.org.

Tulsa Hope Academy will continue to offer on-site and virtual learning as it has for several years, with some modifications based on individual family needs:

Option 1) On campus learning; or

Option 2) Virtual learning at home or (on site in support center).

Option 3) Virtual learning in the support center

On campus learning will be based on a rotating schedule with students attending one week on campus followed by two weeks virtual learning at home or at school in the support center.

Virtual learning at home will require students to be active on morning calls and during virtual instruction by teachers as scheduled in Google Classroom.

Virtual learning w/Support – a Learner Support Center will be open Monday through Thursday 8:30am – 3:30pm for students who are approved for Independent Study or those who prefer to do



virtual learning on campus in the learner support center which will be open on campus Monday through Thursday 8:30am – 3:30pm. Additional office hours are available with instructors by appointment.

The first day of school is traditionally the day after Labor Day - Tuesday, September 8th. This also allows us with more time to make adjustments in response to information on COVID-19.
